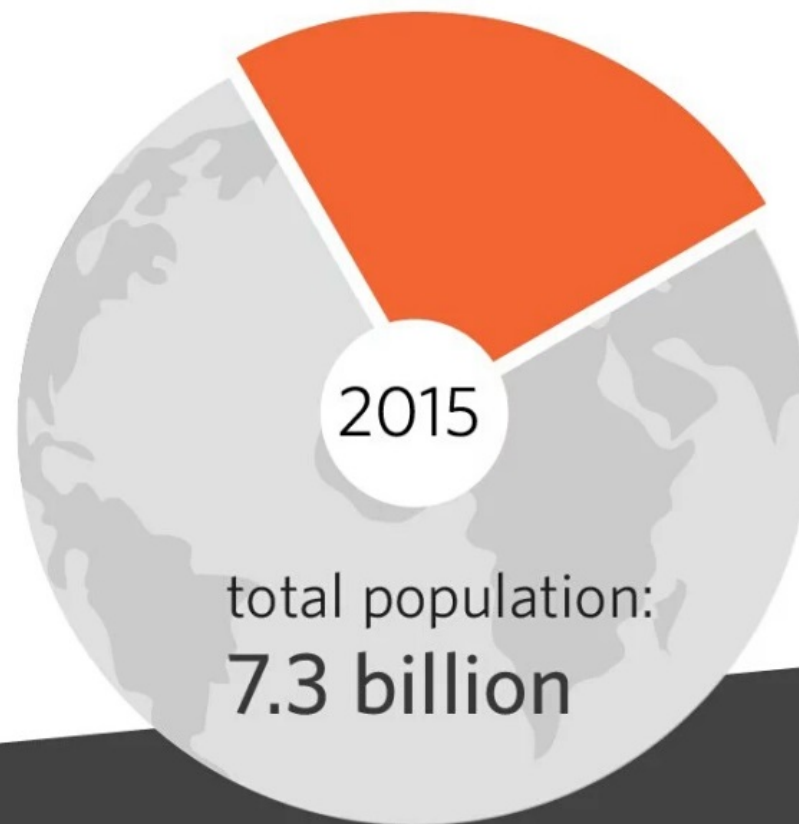

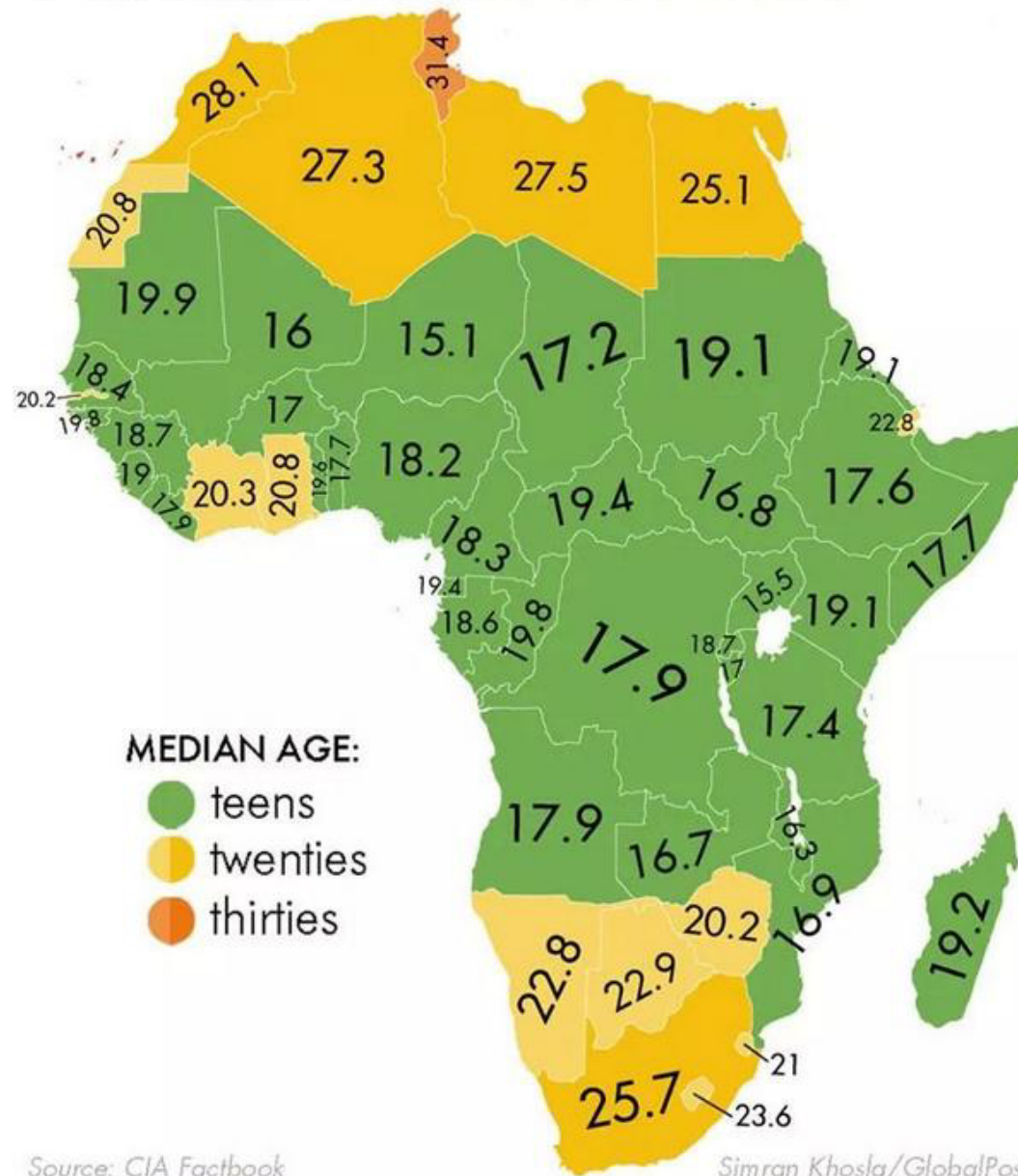

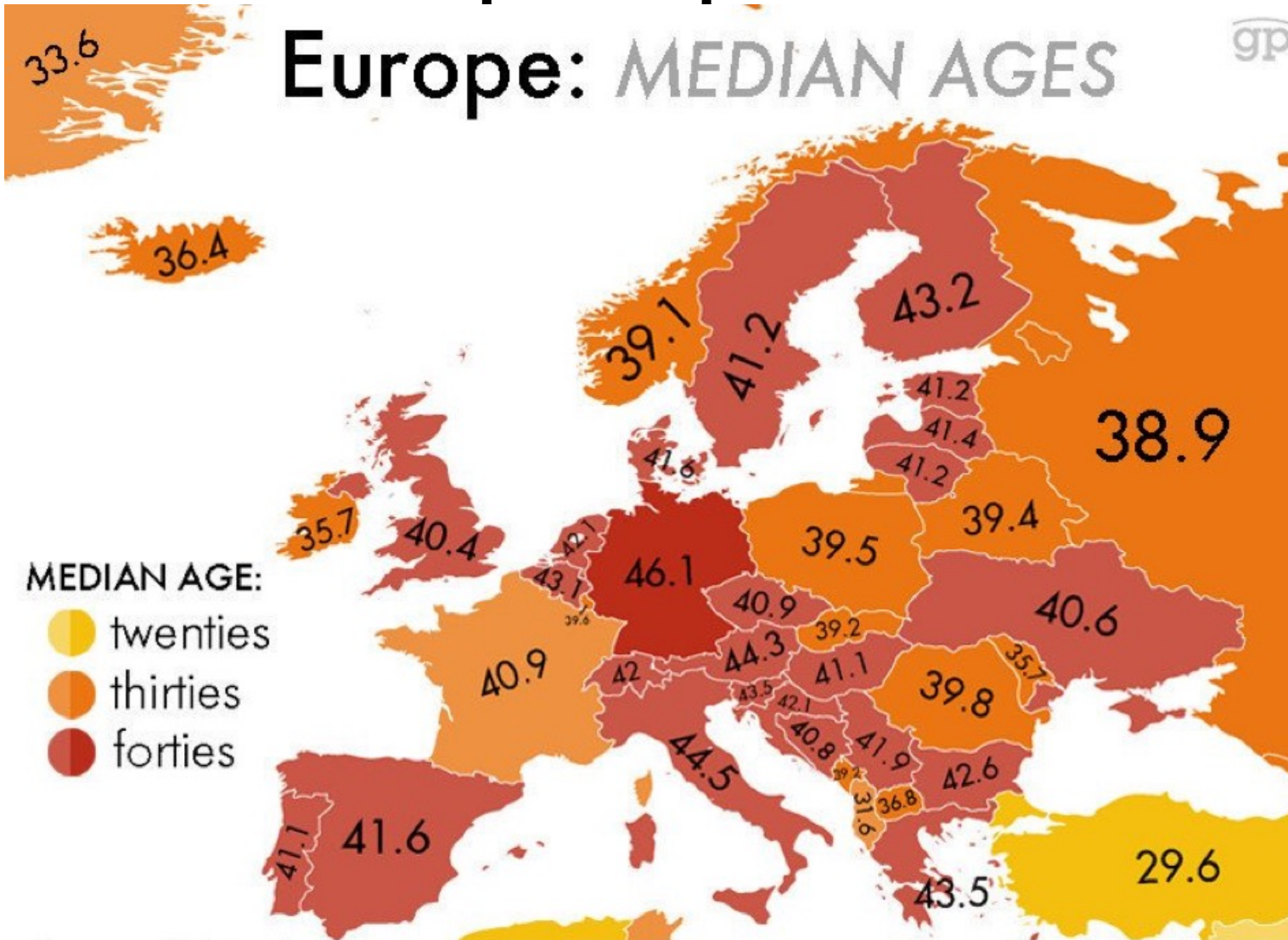

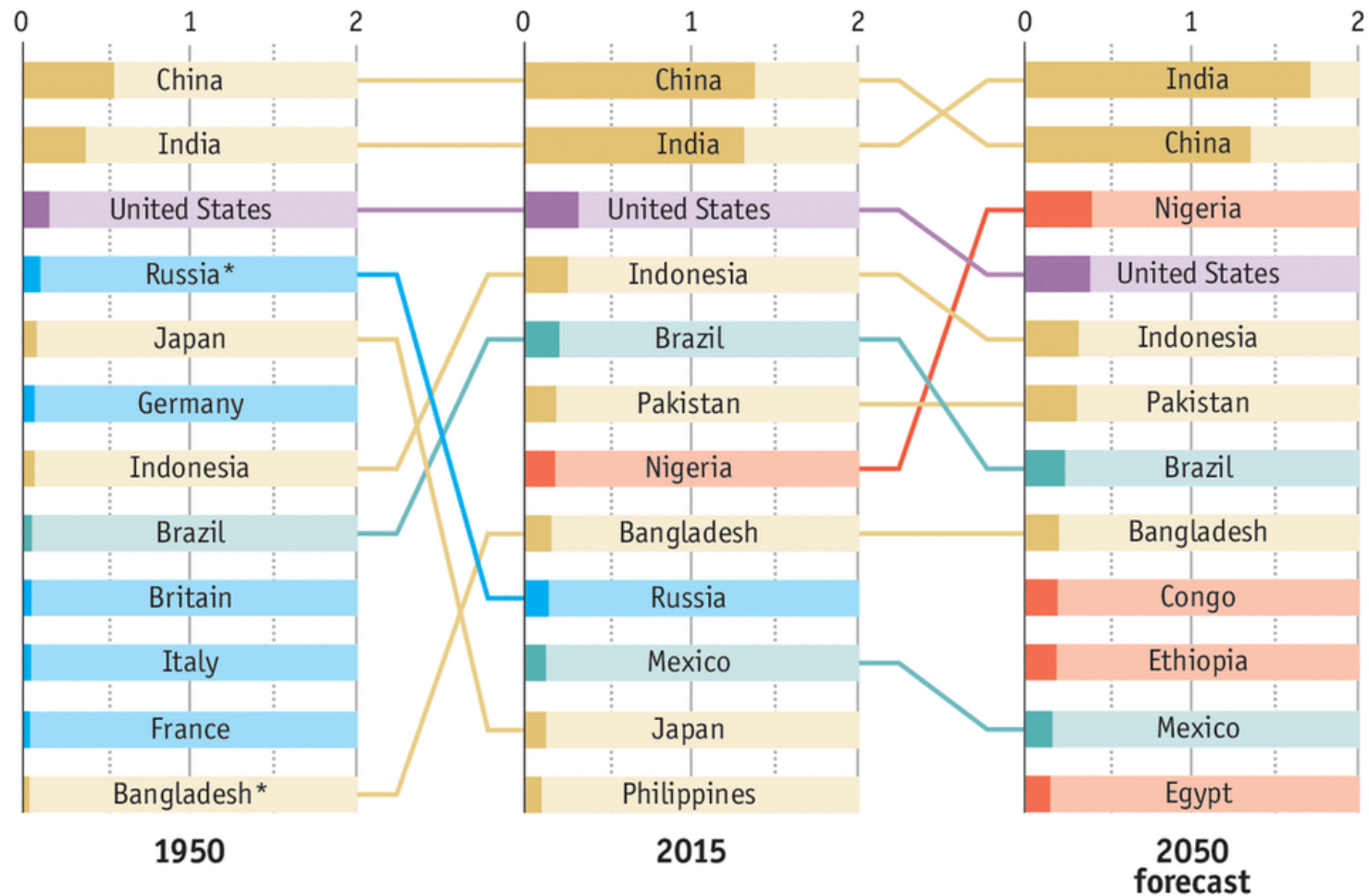

Most populous countries, bn



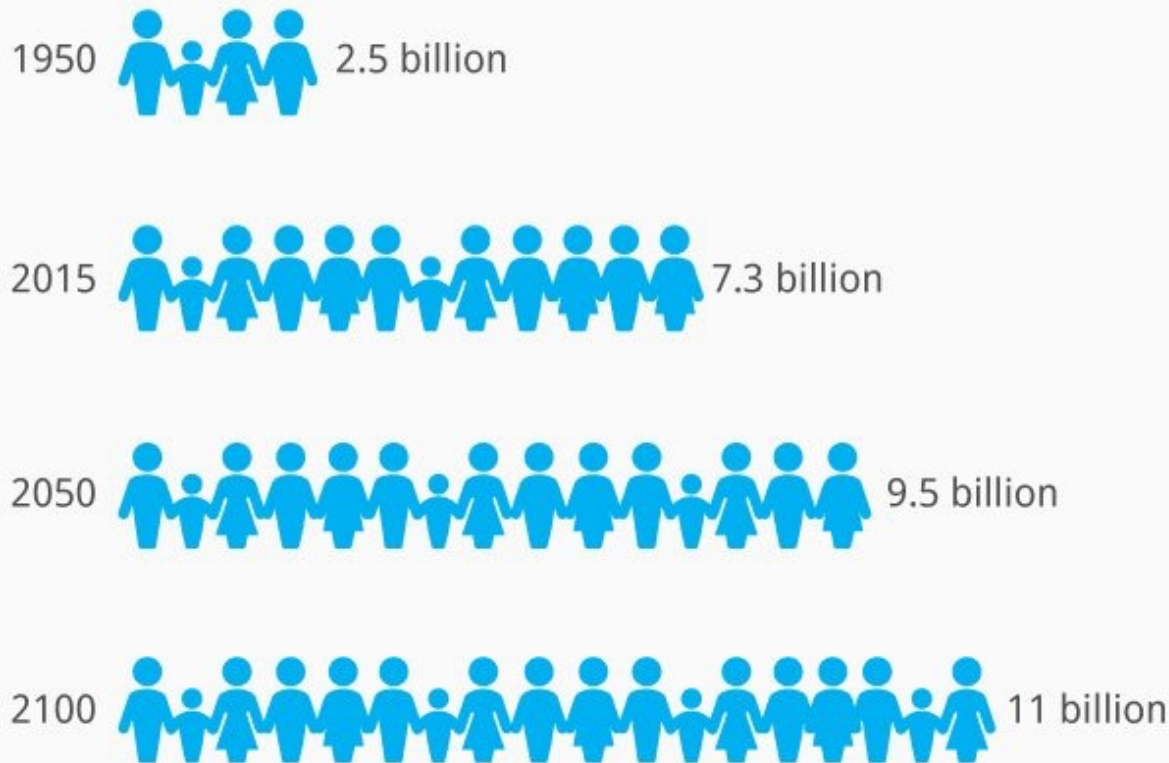

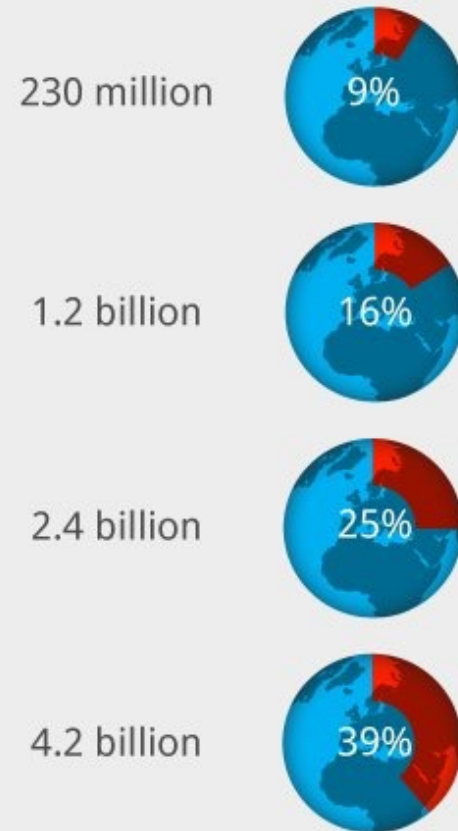
World population forecast with Africa's percentage share

World's Population



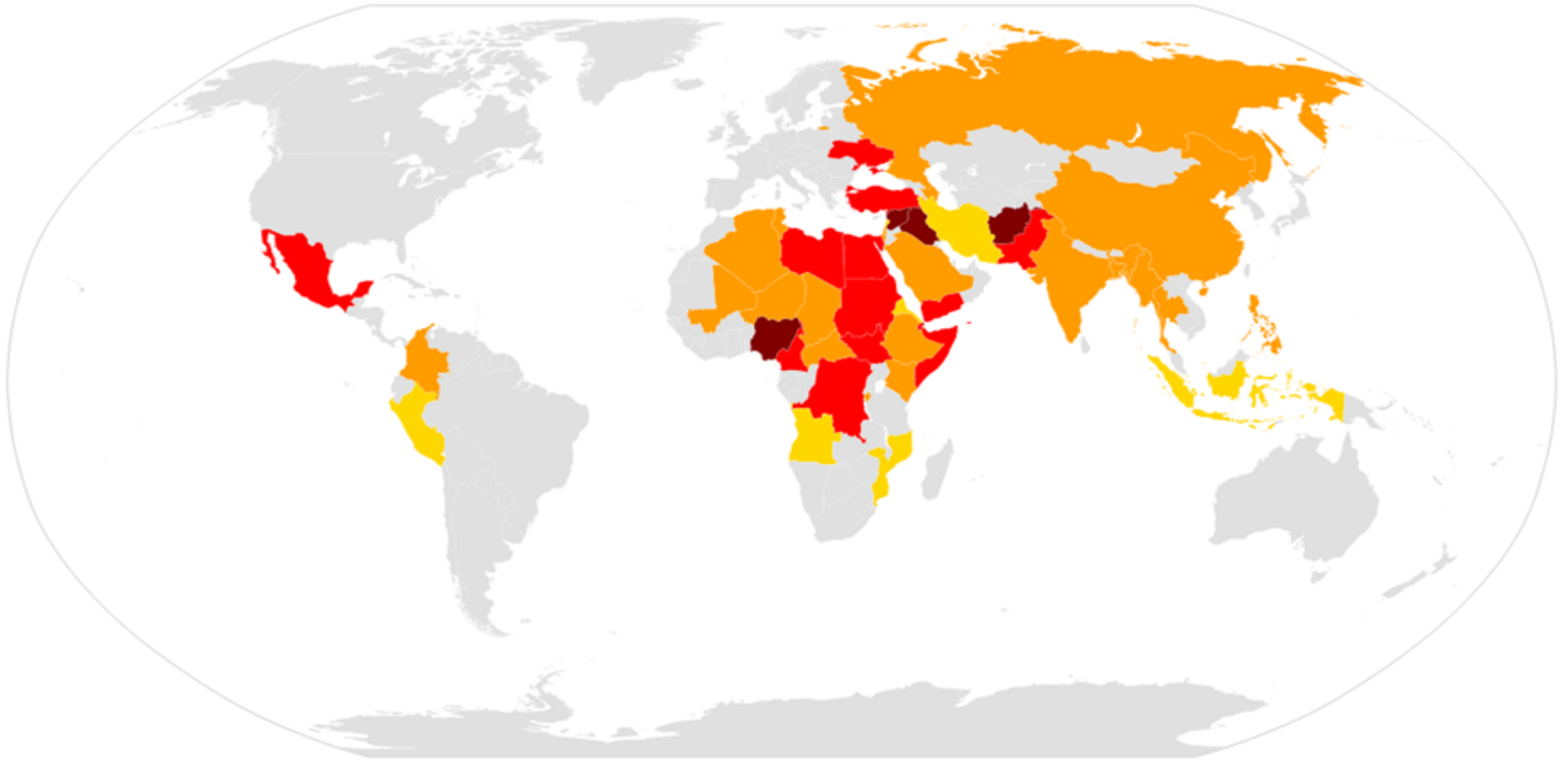

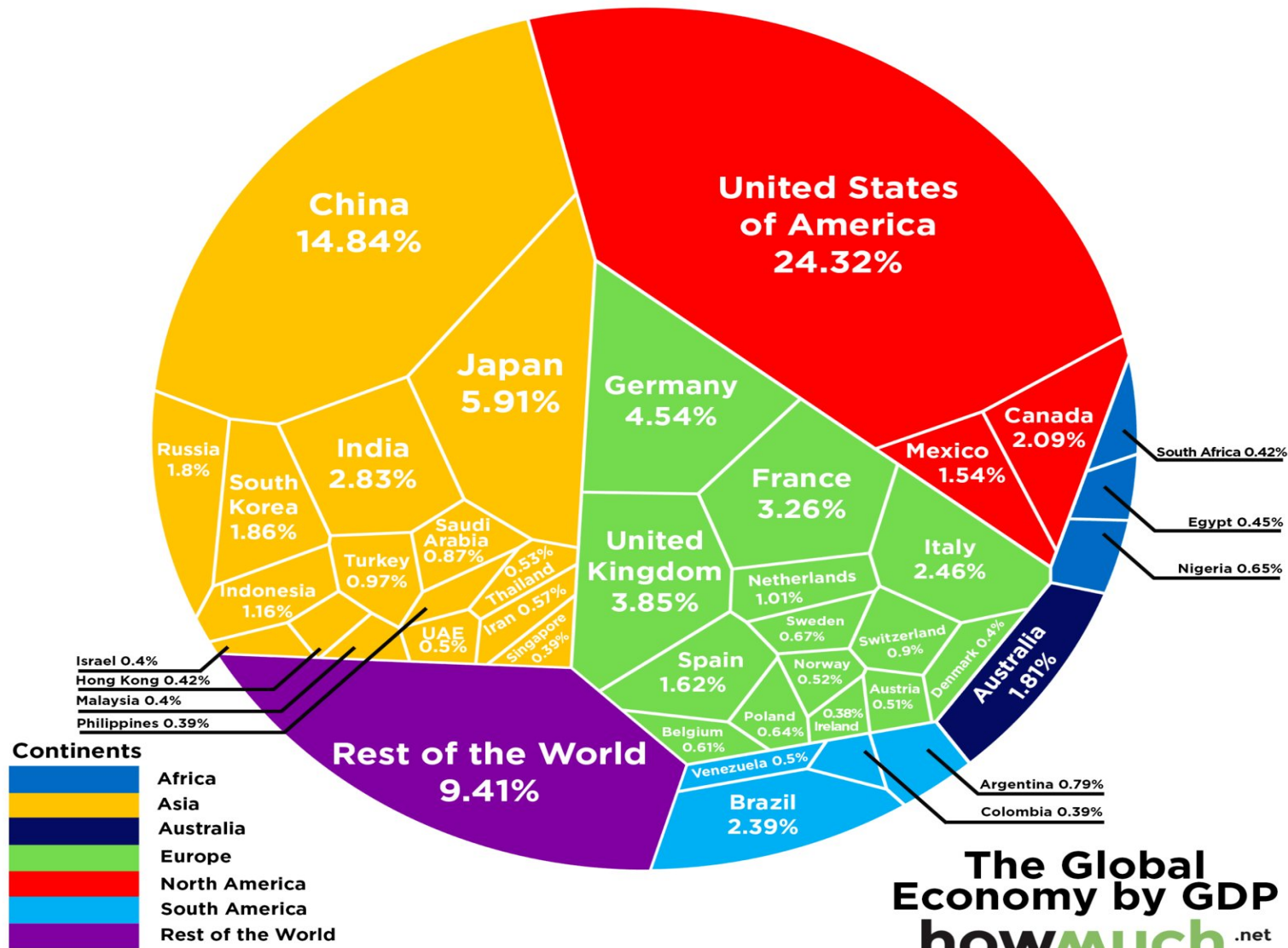

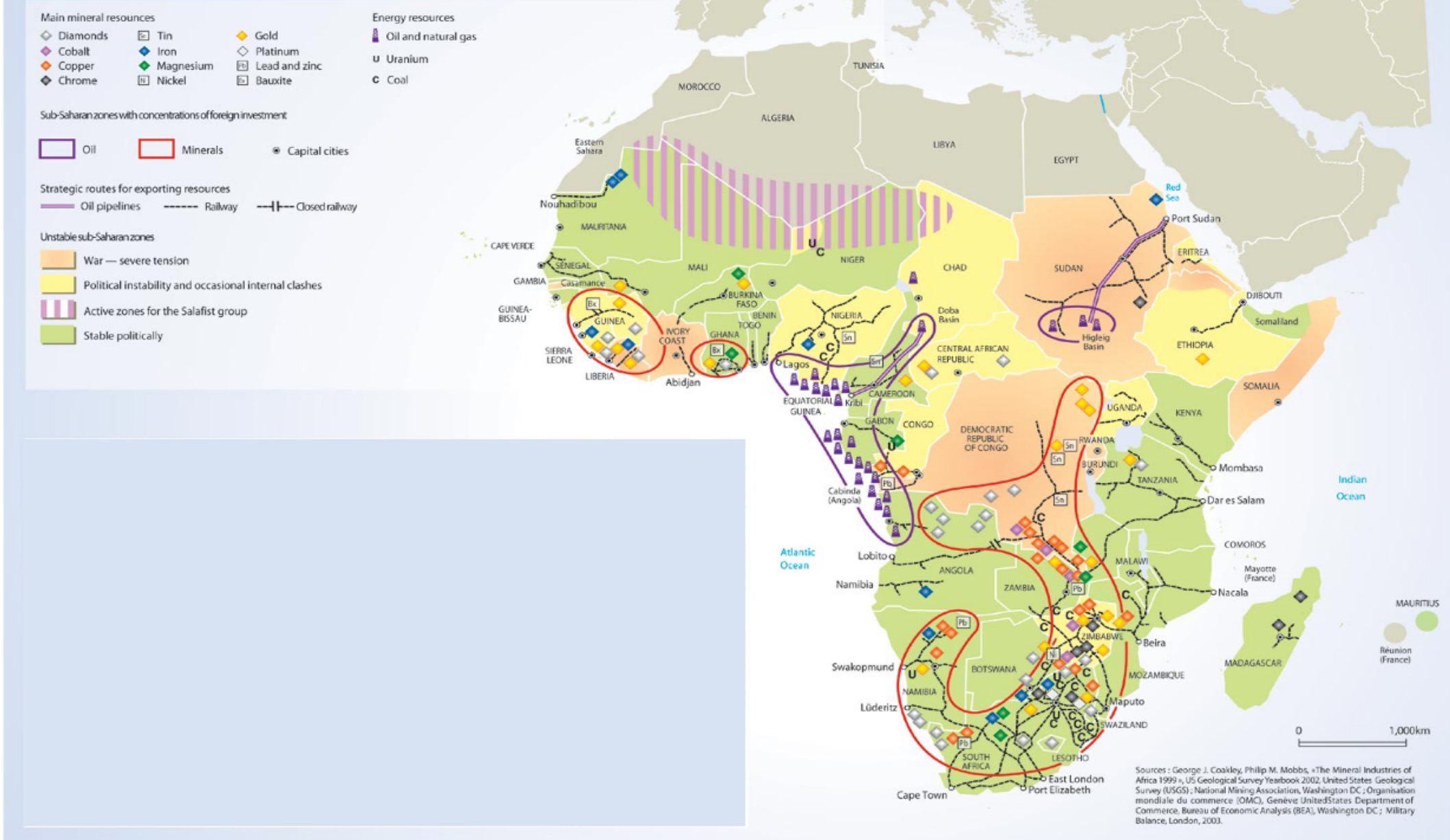
- Major wars, 10,000+ deaths in current or past year

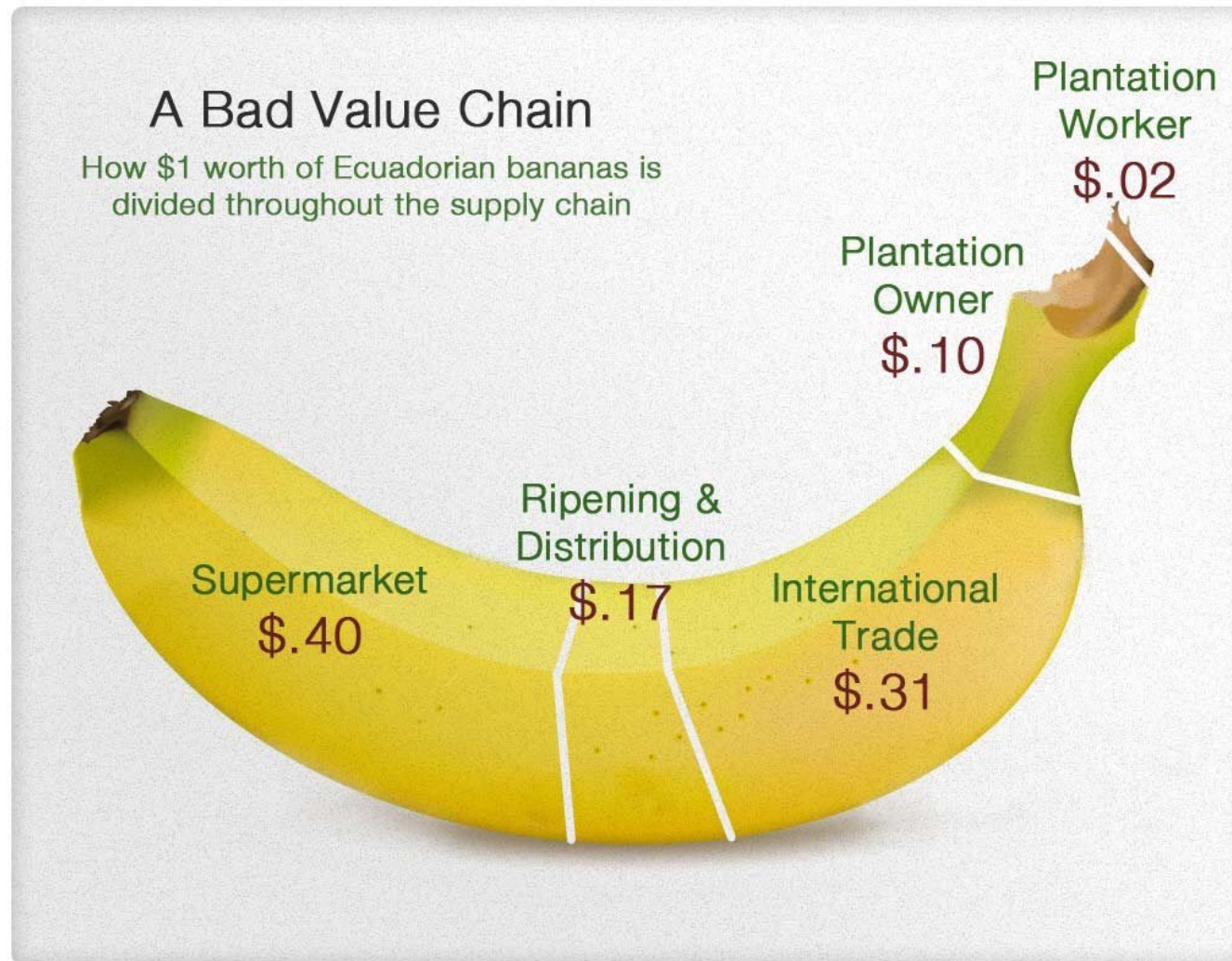

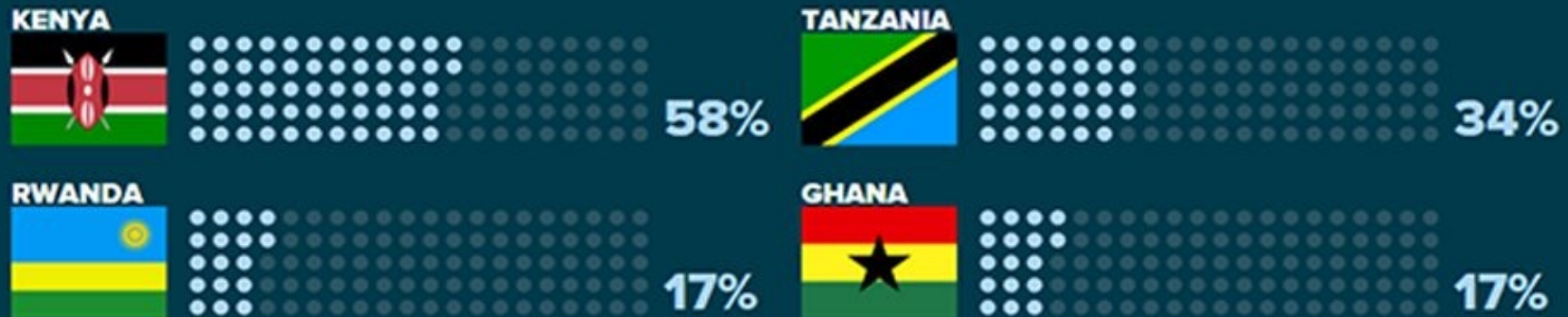
